### What is MST?



- Community-based, family-driven treatment for antisocial/delinquent behavior in youth
- Focus is on "empowering" caregivers (parents) to solve current and future problems
- MST "client" is the entire ecology of the youth - family, peers, school, neighborhood
- Highly structured clinical supervision and quality assurance processes

# Where is MST Being Used?



- More than 30 states in the U.S. and in 12 countries
- Statewide infrastructure in Connecticut,
   Georgia, Hawaii, New Mexico, and Pennsylvania
- Nationwide programs in Norway and Netherlands (20+ teams each)
- Other international replications: Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Denmark, Ireland, Scotland, England, Iceland, Sweden, and Switzerland.

### Vital Statistics



- 450+ teams worldwide
- 1400+ FTE MST clinicians
- 23,000+ youth / families received MST
- At case closure:

Youth living at home: 83%

Youth in school / working: 82%

Youth with no new arrests: 82%

### MST Dissemination



- 1996 2000: MST Services provided direct support to provider organizations implementing MST (many lessons learned about "helping it happen")
- 2000 present: Developed an infrastructure at MST Services to support growing "local" expertise to help implement the model - the Network Partner model


- The objective of the MST Network Partner Model is to develop this highest level of MST clinical, program development and administrative expertise within the system implementing the MST model
- Key Roles within the MST Network Partner organization:
  - MST Program Director/Developer
  - MST System Supervisor



- Key Domains of MST System Development:
  - Fidelity Monitoring, Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement
  - Clinical staff development (training)
  - Program support and development activities, and organizational/systemslevel interventions
  - Outcome monitoring


# MST Quality Assurance System






# MST Expert "Domain"





# MST Program Director/ Developer "Domain"








- Three different types of Network Partners have emerged:
  - Provider organizations that implement MST and choose to develop MST "training capabilities" (Type A)
  - Provider organizations or Centers that want to participate in the dissemination of MST (Type B)
  - Systems (DJJ, DCF, etc.) that established NP organizations for the purpose of the developing, supporting and providing QA oversight of their network of MST teams (Type C)


#### MST Network Partnerships - Structure and Types

# "Type A" MST Network Partner: Training & QA Provided to Employees







#### **Evidence-based Interventions Ontario (EbIO)**




# "Type C" MST Network Partner






#### Advance Behavioral Health (ABH) - Privatized
